

## **Synopsis**

Short tales about deadly books, by top mystery authors An ancient scroll draws a bookseller into a chilling mystery. Monty Danforth finds the tin buried beneath a shipment of leather-bound classics. Anne Perry is the bestselling author of two acclaimed series set in Victorian England: the Charlotte and Thomas Pitt novels, including Buckingham Palace Gardens and Long Spoon Lane, and the William Monk novels, including Execution Dock and Dark Assassin. She is also the author of a series of five World War I novels, as well as seven holiday novels, most recently A Christmas Odyssey, and a historical novel, The Sheen on the Silk, set in the Ottoman Empire. Anne Perry lives in Scotland.

First Sentence: The early winter evening was drawing in. In the antiquarian bookshop well away from the High Street in Cambridge, Monty Danforth sat in his room in the back, working on unpacking and cataloguing the books and papers from the last crate of the Greville Estate. It was a good enough short story. The narrative moves along quickly and is fully developed. The full cost is perhaps a bit excessive. I knew this in advance but I got this at a tremendous markdown so I decided to purchase it. This would have been better included in an anthology of stories of this kind and the full price would then have been commensurate with the value received.

This is a metaphor rather than a mystery: a short story about how an obscure scroll find--its content we never know--will be responded to by those who should know better. It caused me to think, less about stuff versus data and more about how the knowledgeable respond when a scroll may contain something challenging.

Anne Perry is by far a superb author. Within the genre of mystery, she has quite a range in her style of writing that keeps one interested in her novels. This short novel does not fail to further that notion. You are immediately drawn into the story and, provided there are no fires to put out, you will not put

this book down till you are done. The only problem with not pacing is that once you are through with the novel, you will wish there was another to follow.

Anne Perry is an excellent mystery writer. The story gave me goosebumps. I had to delay my supper to finish it. Her short stories are as good as her novels.

Great premise. I found the characters and resolution intriguing, it definitely kept my interest, and I have my own guess as to who Judson Garrett is.

Anne Perry uses her fantastic skills to write a story that lines up with and is compatible with Christianity. This is a book I will read again and again.

As usual, Anne Perry does not disappoint. Being a long time fan, I have read almost all of her books. Each story is riveting, taking the reader to the time and experience of the characters in each series. The characters become like a part of the family; each story leaves one looking forward to the next one. I would recommend this and any other Anne Perry books to all.
