

## **Synopsis**

Omar al-Bashir took control of Sudan in a coup in 1989 and has ruled as a dictator since. In 2003 the Islamist government backed Janjaweed militias in attacking minority tribes (largely Christian and animist) in the Darfur region of Sudan, where 300,000 have died and 5 million have been displaced. In 2008 The International Criminal Court accused al-Bashir of genocide.

Bashir took control of Sudan in a 1989 coup and has been working to establish an Islamist state throughout the country, a movement that began in the late 1970s. The imposition of Sharia law onto the largely non-Muslim south escalated tensions, and the south waged a civil war that lasted until 2002. Altogether, this is a useful and up-to-date look at an ongoing dictatorship. Chapters are organized into different aspects of the regime rather than being in strict chronological order. Photographs are well chosen, and sidebars give readers some background on issues such as Islamism, Sharia, and the Lost Boys of Sudan.
