The main characters for this series are a group of high school friends who continued to be besties as adults and a more diverse and interesting group would be difficult to find although most are gay or bisexual. Blane is one of the quieter members of this group. He is a veterinarian working with exotic animals at a zoo. His budding relationship with artist Falcon, real although exaggerated a bit for Falcon's sister's wedding could use a little more open communication. Both men are hesitant to reach for what they really want from the relationship and both have grown accustomed to settling for a physical relationship. I love reading stories created by this author as there is a special way of making you feel the emotion, "The chemistry was strangely unbearable. It made him itch for more, and at the same time, he felt..vulnerable." This about a character who was more accustomed to hookups than relationships. And Falcon's Aunt Vera is a hoot when she explained her harsh words to Falcon's ex.. "Shhh. I didn't like the shape of his nose. It was either that (making him leave) or reshape it". And that was before he did his worst or best to break up this relationship. Excellent story by this one-click favorite author!

Grasp is the second in a series on a band of brothers, Significant Brothers. What I love about each of these books is their lightheartedness and low angst because sometimes you just need a getaway and these provide that.
