

I was sadly disappointed by this book. I LOVED "Rush" & a small part of me hoped this second book would continue with Gabe & Mia's story instead of moving along to Jace, but I read it anyway. In all honesty, I think the books would have been better if they HAD continued on with Gabe & Mia's

story, including marriage & children.Instead, we were given Jace's story. A very unrealistic, almost painful read.1. I'm pretty sure "her eyes widened" was the MOST frequent line in this whole book. Generally, female readers are the ones reading these types of "romance" books. We want to be able to identify with the main female character so that we can relate & picture ourselves in her place. Aside from her being homeless, Beth was a very weak-willed character. She seemed timid & weak throughout the whole book and I found myself rolling my eyes at how often she seemed to just stare at whoever was talking to her with "wide eyes". She spent 80% of this book like a deer in headlights.2. Can we just talk about the excessive cursing for a second? I'm no prude, but is it seriously necessary that "Jace swore" (& every other curse word) need to be used in every other sentence? Book 2 of the Breathless Trilogy has a lot to recommend it. The storyline is riveting and intense. Jace the brother of Mia from Book 1, is attending Mia and Gabe's engagement party. He sees a woman who's working with the catering service, across the room and is immediately interested in her, while he's deciding how to approach her, Ash his partner and friend, notices Jace's attraction and since they share women, he asks if she will spend the night with them. Britanny is tired and hungry, she's looking forward to eating some of the food left from the party - one of the perks of being with the catering staff. But she's also afraid she won't have anywhere to sleep for the night and its very cold out. This is how the story starts and it is fast and furious after that. Britanny's story is very shocking, she has been homeless for four years, her only family is Jack her best friend from foster homes. Jace is immediately protective of her and wants to care for and take care of her. But there are issues that he doesn't know about in her life and she feels that he only wants her for a while and she will have to go back to being homeless. I would have liked to know why she was in foster care, although leaving it out did not detract from the story. There are some rough spots, Jace's dominant personality sometimes comes off as spoiled and petty rather than dominant and his temper is too short. Britanny is a child of the streets and you expect her to have issues with trust. The book was very good, there are intense sexual scenes but you expect that from Maya Banks. I defintely liked this better than the first book.

I swear I don't know why I read books like this. The men are always obscenely older than the women. They are always extremely good looking with more money than God and annoyingly arrogant. And no matter what kind of kink they're into they always miraculously find a woman who is, against all odds, into it to. Also, at some point in the story he will have the thought that he would like to see his woman "round with his child in her belly". Give me a break! Jace is an a-hole.
