

This is an excellent book for those experiencing infertility or many other forms of loss. It is also a great book for those who know someone with infertility. The author walks the reader through her experience with infertility & shows the struggles she (and her husband) encountered. The author is religious & that was a significant part of her experience, but she presents it in a very good way that isn't overbearing & that (I feel) even the non-religious should be able to relate to. This book does a great job of helping you see that your emotional responses are ok. You are allowed to feel however you feel, you shouldn't be ashamed of how you feel, nor should you feel pressured to just "get over" your feelings; they are real & valid. You need to find a way to work with and through them, but you aren't "bad" for feeling them. She also gives some insight into how to work through hard times with your spouse, how to stay close when you both are intensely hurting & could easily just splinter. All in all, I thought the book was wonderful & I recommend it.

This was a great read. I feel like most books about infertility discuss statistics and dissect charts. This book actually takes you through the emotional experience of infertility from the very beginning. I also really like that this isn't a "success story." It doesn't end with, "and now I have a baby." Sometimes the struggle with infertility doesn't end with a baby, and it's nice to know that you can be ok before a baby comes, and even if they don't. It's a great read whether you've had an experience with infertility or not. This hasn't been a struggle to me personally, but I have several friends who are going through it. Reading this gave me more insight to what they are going through and how I can help. There's even a "what ok to ask and what's not ok to ask" section. Very informative and very interesting. I couldn't put it down.
