

Omega Guardian picks up where Omega Exile left off. Guardian continues to follow Mr. Buetcher as he attempts to right wrongs perpetrated in the Omega Sector of the galaxy. While Omega Exile was mostly a character driven story, Omega Guardian is non stop sci-fi action with unexpected twists throughout. Arseneault succeeds in introducing and developing likable characters as well as fleshing out those we already know from Exile. The plot was well thought out and original. With all the free and .99 cent books available on the kindle, I seldom spend 3.99 on an ebook. After reading the free offering of the first book, I was willing to spend 3.99 on the second entrance to the series based on the fact that it was good clean fun that I can share with my kids. I appreciate the fact that both books are devoid of sex and profanity. Mr. Arseneault, I applaud you for creating an entertaining series that I can read to my kids. I really like this Author and this series in particular. It is a fast paced adventure series with lots of action. It keeps you guessing and on your toes with surprises coming at every corner. But no matter

what happens Knog always has a plan up his sleeve. He is like an alien 007 without all the secret weapons 007 had at his disposal. But he always makes due. I've already purchased the next book and my plan is to read every book that Stephen writes. I would suggest you start with Stephens first writings and work you way thru as they are all loosely tied together of a huge span of history similar to the span of the Foundation Trilogy by Asimov.

After Joni is captured during the revolt, Knog is an outcast and demoted. Predictably, he becomes an activist in his squalid housing complex and earns the respect and admiration of the decent residents as he faces down the antagonists. Knog disrupts the security inspectors and tries, unsuccessfully, to expel the corrupt Govenor. The action is fast-paced with myriad plot twists and surprises and I liked the new characters and new species and new settings; however, I hoped that Joni would be rescued. Instead, the author takes the reader on a wild trip to a mining planet and planets in the Omega system. The climax is unexpected but satisfying -the good guys prevail, of course, setting up book 3.

This book just took off from the first book. It was like a continuation of the first book, just a different story line. I was entertained, there are a few plot changes that had me laughing out loud. As soon as I finish this review, I will be buying the 3rd book in this series. A solid good read, I hope you enjoy it as much as I did.

I wanted to read a few SciFi book this fall and picked the Omega series as one to dive into. I have enjoyed the series. The only problem I had was the misuse of 'galaxy'. Galaxies have trillions of stars and are huge distances apart. One galaxy could not invade another to control it, the scale is just too ridiculously large. 'Star systems' within a galaxy would be a better description even though that still encompasses mind bending distances. Other than that I am enjoying the series.

The entire Omega series is a great read. I found this series well-written, with complex characters (right wrong issues) sudden reversals that make the stores suspenseful, full of surprises, and great fun to read.
