

This book is outstanding. It came recommended by my pastor who suggested it even though he did not know that I have difficulty trusting God at times. Then again, I think it is safe to say that most have difficulty trusting Him at one time or another. This is essentially about the providence and sovereignty of God. In learning to trust God it is important to understand who He is, and because of who God is (sovereign and provident) I can trust Him. He knows all. He sees all. The more a person gains a clearer understanding of God's sovereignty and providence, the more liberating and freeing it is to trust Him. Sovereignty has to do with $God\tilde{A}f\hat{A}\phi\tilde{A}$ â $\neg\tilde{A}$ â, ϕ s authority and power while providence is the means by which He governs all things both here and in the universe. Because He is both, I can trust Him with everything that happens to me. Believe me when I say that trusting God is not always easy to do (for me anyway). I have been a Christian for over 30 years. I am only about 60 pages into this book, but it has already given me a wonderful reminder that EVERYTHING that happens in my life, whether good or bad, has been foreordained by God for my

good as a believer (Rom. 8:28-29). Though I have not questioned the sovereignty of God in the major life-changing incidents in my life (the death of a spouse, the illness and near-death of a child, etc.), somehow there was a disconnect about the seemingly little events in my life--like the person who pulls out in front of me on the road or the coffee I spilled all over the carpet. Those incidents provoked in me a response of anger and frustration, instead of realizing (as Jerry Bridges points out) that all those events are also for my good, to help me to learn a better response. This book has helped me to evaluate everything in my life as under the careful, watchful eye of my Father, who is using the good, the bad, the frustrating, to make me more like His Son. I can't wait to finish the book, and I have already bought 7 more copies to share with family and friends who are in difficult times.

I originally read the book several years ago and found it encouraging and most useful. As with any good book. I kept it on my shelf for the future. I just finished reading and studying it a 2nd time, and I discovered important lessons I missed the first time. I have come to trust God more deeply than before and experienced joy like never before. This book is for everyone, especially those in the darkest places to have God shine His light more clearly.

Point: God's Sovereignty, Wisdom, and Love enable the believer to trust Him in all circumstances. Path: Following the principles in Scripture, Bridges divides this work into fourteen chapters addressing our trust and God's trustfulness in three areas: Sovereignty, Wisdom, and Love. Bridges' own personal life is used as a testimony.
