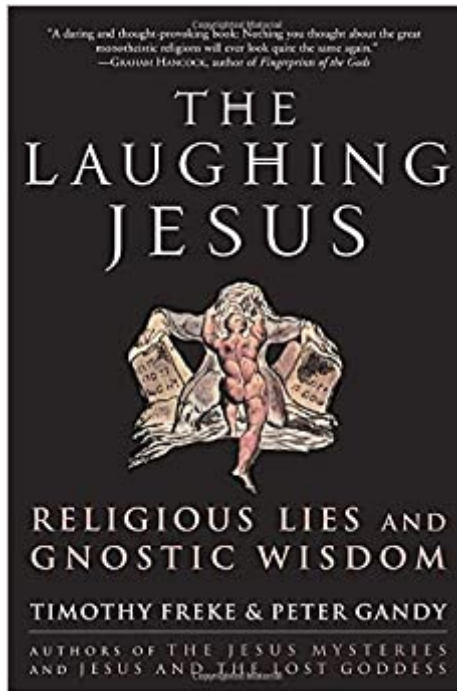

I got hooked on all of Tim Freke's work a number of years ago and this book does not disappoint.

I have read everything by Freke and Gandy written since the *Jesus Mysteries*: Was the "Original Jesus" a Pagan God?. It has all been interesting and valuable in my research on the nature of God. I don't agree with all of their points but their writing certainly makes you think. The idea that Jesus was not a historical man, but instead was a religious myth is not supported by today's biblical scholars but certainly worthy of consideration. Only about 2% of the PHDs who study Jesus are in that camp. Like much from the first few centuries CE the ability to be certain and definitive is lacking. My research for "Seeking God at the Idol Meat BBQ" concluded that whatever you believe about God, Jesus, Buddha, or Allah must be taken on faith not facts.

Very good follow up to the *Jesus Mysteries* in that it offers a clearer understanding of the early Gnostic period and questions

the validity of all the stuff that describes the history of Christianity as most of us have come to know it. I believe it leads to a better understanding of how Constantine and the early Catholic Church influenced the Christian Bible etc.
