

My favorite part of writing is creating a character profile and building the character arc. I'm already a long-time fan and supporter of K. M. Weiland's work, nonfiction, and fiction. I think this may be my favorite yet of her nonfiction books. I learned new tricks and connections I had not thought about or given a lot of thought. Asking "the right question" is so much more important than just asking questions about the story and character. Asking is a way to begin, but "the right question" will carry you through to the end. Weiland's great genius as a writing teacher is her ability to translate theory into practical advice. This book is no exception. Creating Character Arcs is her best yet, layering real wisdom on top of the insights from Structuring Your Novel. In her latest, Weiland shows how character development -- far from being in competition with plot -- fits within a novel's structure. Indeed, character development IS a novel's structure. As with all of Weiland's wonderful writing books, Creating Character Arcs is written in clear, accessible language, is thorough in its treatment, has well-chosen examples, and bridges the gap between art and technique. But this one not only maintains Weiland's standards -- it takes the advice to another level. I'm very confident my ongoing projects will be richer and stronger for having read this book. I've been trying to write a novel-length story worth publishing for some time now. With Ms. Weiland's help, I believe I've reached that point, and hope to prove that with my own book someday soon. I've read books, articles, and blog posts on the craft of writing for years. The big turning point in my evolution as a writer came with my reading of this book. Couple this book with Ms. Weiland's Â 5 Secrets of Story Structure: How to Write a Novel That Stands Out (Helping Writers Become Authors Book 6), and you will have a good grasp of how to structure a story that will captivate readers. No, those two books alone won't be sufficient to teach you all you need to know to write a publishable novel, and they won't take the place of actual writing experience. There are no magic books that will teach you how to write best-sellers, so don't expect these books to do that. But if you have been

trying to write novel-length stories and feel you're missing something, these books might fill in some of the gaps in your knowledge, like they did for me. Yes, I still have more to learn, but I suspect the need to learn will never go away. Ms. Weiland writes with clarity, and has years of experience to draw on. She regularly posts helpful info on her blog, which I also recommend to aspiring writers.

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
