

The grandson of Devereux Milburn, one of America's greatest players, Milburn (Sheltered Lives) provides everything the uninitiated need to know about polo, together with a history of the game from its origins in Tibet to its spread-first to India, then to England, then to America and finally to Argentina, which has dominated the international circuit since 1932. Disabusing readers of the notion that polo is an effete game, Milburn points out that a two-ambulance contest is standard and a four-ambulance battle not unheard-of. He suggests that polo is not a rich man's sport, but the mention of such names as Winston Churchill and Prince Charles weakens his argument considerably. He concludes that the golden age of polo was just prior to WWI and that the U.S. had its last great years in the late 1930s (Tommy Hitchcock, probably the greatest player ever, died in WWII). For those interested in polo, Milburn has penned a loving yet tough social history of the game. While tracing its origins to Tibet and giving historical background of its development, Milburn concentrates on the United States, particularly Long Island. To his credit, Milburn does not shirk from reporting on the polo culture's blemishes, which include some unconscionable treatment of horses. He also

reports on the increasing role of women riders in polo matches. While the book is well written, its appeal is limited to the most knowl-edgeable and serious polo fan. Milburn does a marvelous job of discussing the history surrounding the game of Polo. While failing to examine the play of the game itself, Milburn does present an astute assesment of polo's past, present and future. Most noteworthy, is Milburn's astute representation of the origins of the sport. From the "noble" birth of the game to the dangers presented by its initiation into the world of modern professional sports, Milburn presents the reader with a brilliant and relatively objective view of the game. He avoids further facilitation of the aristocratic aura surrounding the sport and notes that increasingly, it is becoming a sport for all classes. He also, rather bravely, notes the inherent dangers of the sport, thus also dispelling any dellusions one might have as to the nobility of a game played solely by kings and princes. In doing so, he is able to instill a sense of reality into a sport that may seem larger than life. Finally, Milburn emphasizes that the sport is about the play itself and not about an image. By retaining this ideal, the game of polo can continue indefinately as a gentleman's sport.
